LWV Sets Water Workshop

The New Orleans League of Women Voters with the assistance of the Environmental Protection Agency, will sponsor a Water Workshop to which the public is invited at 1 p.m. Wednesday in Albertus Magnus Hall of St. Mary's Dominican College.

The workshop is designed to encourage local organizations to become involved in efforts by the EPA, the state and the community to control water pollution.

According to a representa-

tive of the League, "Section 101 (e) of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act Amendments of 1972 requires that the EPA and the state encourage and assist public participation in the development of the nation's water pollution abatement act program."

"Across the country, workshops are being held to help fulfill this requirement. In New Orleans, a roster of public agency representatives and interested private citizens will

help to educate the public in its rights under this act. All persons who want clean water in Louisiana are urged to attend the workshop which will be free of charge."
